

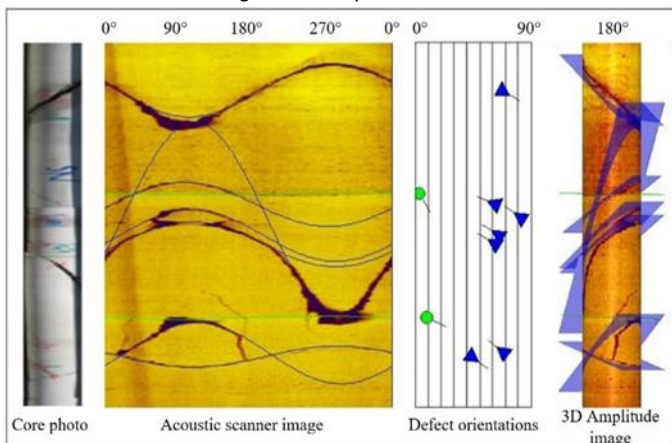
ACOUSTIC SCANNER/OPTICAL TELEVIEWER INTERPRETATION

We provide orientation data from downhole geophysical and acoustic/optical logs. This data can assist with ground and slope stability assessment, infrastructure planning and development, optimisation of foundations and drainage, and potential hazard reduction.

OUR SERVICES COMPRISE

- manual interpretation of defects from acoustic scanner and optical televiewer data
- if available, core photographs and geotechnical logs are used to perform an *integrated interpretation* of the scanner data. This type of interpretation is a speciality of *asims* and provides a more thorough assessment of data and greater confidence in identified discontinuities
- analysis of interpreted data, including grouping data into major and minor sets and extracting average orientations
